#### **A)INTRODUCTION**

Femicide and gender-based violence (GBV) have reached crisis levels in Kenya, posing a significant threat to the safety and well-being of women and girls. Recent reports from **Africa Data Hub** and the **2024 Kenya Security Report** indicate a disturbing rise in cases, prompting urgent action from both the government and civil society. In response, **self-defense training** has emerged as a crucial tool in empowering women and girls with the skills to protect themselves and assert their right to safety.

On March 7, 2024, in partnership with UNFPA Kenya, Polycom Girls commemorated International Women's Day under the theme 'Accelerate Action' with a Taekwondo Self-Defense and Personal Safety Session at Rowland Camp. The initiative aimed to equip adolescent girls and young women with essential self-defense skills and awareness, reinforcing their ability to respond to threats and advocate for their own safety.

# POLYCOM GIRLS AND UNFPA KENYA COMMEMORATE INTERNATIONAL WOMEN'S DAY WITH SELF-DEFENSE TRAINING TO COMBAT GENDER-BASED VIOLENCE

Femicide and gender-based violence (GBV) have reached crisis levels in Kenya, claiming the lives of countless women and girls. According to Africa Data Hub, Kenya recorded approximately 127 femicide cases, while the 2024 Kenya Security Report revealed over 7,100 reported cases of GBV since September 2023. The alarming rise in cases prompted the Kenyan government to form a special committee to address the crisis. In response to this urgent issue, self-defense knowledge has become a vital tool for women and girls, equipping them with the skills to protect themselves and assert their right to safety.

On 7th March 2024, in partnership with UNFPA Kenya, Polycom Girls commemorated International Women's Day under the theme 'Accelerate Action' with a Taekwondo Self-Defense and Personal Safety Session at Rowland Camp. This initiative aims to empower adolescent girls and young women by providing them with essential self-defense skills and personal safety knowledge.

During the event, **Jane Anyango**, **Founder of Polycom Girls**, emphasized the importance of preventative measures: "We are creating a space where girls can learn to take care of themselves, say no to violence, and advocate for their safety. This is about empowering them with knowledge, confidence, and self-protection skills." She pointed out that the day's session had 120 girls, but the numbers would increase as the program gets introduced to other counties.

Caroline Murgor, GBV and Gender Advisor for UNFPA Kenya, highlighted the 'Sports for Protection' program which they have been running, has been instrumental in escalating awareness about GBV among young people. "Through this initiative, young people learn how to protect themselves from violence while also becoming champions of change in their communities." She further noted that addressing femicide and GBV must be holistic, involving both men and boys as allies in creating a safer society.

Caroline Ambani, Taekwondo Coach Specializing in Self-Defense, reiterated that self-defense is not about fighting but about empowerment and safety. "Femicide is rampant. I believe that by equipping girls with self-defense skills, we can contribute to reducing these tragic cases. It is crucial that they learn how to protect themselves and stay safe."

Master Benson Voiya, Chairman of the Nairobi Taekwondo Association, stressed the importance of training women in self-defense, as they are disproportionately affected by GBV. Daniel Ochieng Maboso, a representative from one of the schools engaged in Polycom's programs, underscored the challenges girls face, including unsafe home environments, lack of sanitary pads, and cultural barriers. He called for greater incorporation of self-defense training in school curriculums.

In her speech ,UNFPA Deputy Representative, Pilar de la Corte Molina pointed out that "Every ten minutes, a girl or woman somewhere in the world dies in the hands of an intimate partner or as a result of gender-based violence. While self-defense training builds confidence, the real solution lies in policy-making, community engagement, and working with stakeholders to create an environment where women and girls are treated equally."

The Taekwondo self-defense sessions are serving as a powerful platform for advocacy, awareness, and action in addressing gender-based violence and femicide. We call upon the media to amplify this crucial conversation and urge the government, communities, and institutions to take stronger action in protecting women and girls.
